### *THE MATCHUP*

\* Fairmont State and Clarion open the 2010 season under the lights at Memorial Field on Thursday night.

\* Fans can listen to the game live online at FightingFalcons.com.

\* The Falcons return 14 starters, eight on defense and six on offense from a team that finished 3-8 last season.

\* Clarion returns 19 starters from a team that finished 8-3 in 2009. The Golden Eagles are 12-36 under head coach Jay Foster.

\* Clarion leads the all-time series 10-5 between the two schools. FSU has won two of the last three.

\* The Golden Eagles won last year's meeting 33-21 in Fairmont.

\* Three of Fairmont State's five victories in the series have come at Clarion, including a 23-20 win in 2008. Alex Ashley kicked the game-winner as time expired to lift FSU to the victory.

\* Mike Lopez is 2-1 in season openers as a head coach. He is also 2-1 as a head coach against Clarion.

\* Since 2000, Fairmont State is 7-3 in season openers.

### *FIVE FALCON FACTS YOU NEED TO KNOW*

1. Senior **Zack Page** is just three yards shy of setting the NCAA Division II record for career kick return yardage.

2. Freshman QB **Logan Moore** is a Fairmont native who starred at Fairmont Senior High School a year ago.

3. New offensive coordinator **Bryan Fisher** is the brother of new Florida State head coach Jimbo Fisher.

4. Senior RB **Doug Brazill** had a career-high 219 yards rushing against Clarion in 2007. In the last two meetings, though, Brazill has been held to a total of 103 yards.

5. Senior WR **Perry Baker** scored a touchdown on his first touch of the season last year vs. Clarion (a 51-yard rushing TD). However, Baker was injured later on in the game and was never the same the rest of the season.



## **2010 PRESEASON NOTES**

\* Fairmont State returns seven letterwinners on each side of the ball.

\* The Falcon offensive line is anchored by left tackle Matt Khouri. Khouri, a senior out of Pittsburgh, Pa., was slowed by injuries as a junior but was a first team All-WVIAC pick and the team's highest rated offensive lineman as a sophomore.

\* On defense, the Falcons have talent and experience on the line and in the secondary. Up front is junior defensive end Luke Black who was a first team All-WVIAC pick a season ago. In the secondary is free safety Dewey McDonald who turned heads as a freshman by earning first team All-League honors.

\* The linebacking corps is one that needs to be fleshed out in camp. Senior Dan Dario is one of the only Falcons who has seen significant regular action over the past few seasons.

\* On special teams, FSU kick returner Zack Page headlines one of the top units in the country. Page is just shy of a pair of NCAA Division II records as the season begins. The Falcons have a new face in place kicker Frank Keenan, an established rugby player from England, and welcome back punter Ben Landis who missed 2009 with a knee injury.

\* The Falcons were picked to finish seventh in the WVIAC in a vote conducted by the league coaches.

## **COACHING NOTES**

\* Mike Lopez is entering his fourth season as head coach of the Falcons. He spent the previous five seasons serving as the team's defensive coordinator.

\* Lopez, a Clarksburg, W.Va., native, has steadfastly maintained that he wants to build a "West Virginia All-Star" team at Fairmont State and has hauled in some of the state's top talent to Fairmont. Over half of the team hails from the Mountain State.

\* FSU added Bryan Fisher to its coaching staff as the offensive coordinator. Fisher most recently was a high school head coach at Robert C. Byrd. He is the brother of Florida State head coach Jimbo Fisher.

\* Fairmont State utilized that connection with Florida State and spent a week with the Seminole staff sharing ideas and strategies during the spring.

\* QB coach Shannon Kelley played the position at the University of Texas from 1984-89. He is married to former Olympic gold winning gymnast and Fairmont native Mary Lou Retton.

\* Fairmont State has three former high school head coaches on its staff with Bryan Fisher (Robert C. Byrd), J.L. Abbott (Fairmont Senior) and Richard laquinta (Robert C. Byrd).

\* The Falcons have seven alums on the coaching staff: Mike Lopez, Gary Lanham, Mike Fortier, J.L. Abbott, John Marano, Shahram Shafii and Mike Mainella.

## **DEWEY DOES IT**

\* Freshman Dewey McDonald had an outstanding freshman campaign.

\* McDonald established a new Fairmont State single season record with 161 interception return yards in 2009. He had five interceptions on the year and returned one for a touchdown.

\* McDonald, a native of Ranson, W.Va., was a first team All-WVIAC pick.

\* His first career interception was last season against Clarion.

## **BLACK & BLUE**

\* Junior defensive end Luke Black is continuing the legacy left by his brothers at Fairmont State by being one of the top defensive players in the country.

\* Black has 14 sacks to his credit after two seasons and is just shy of cracking FSU's career top 10 leaders in sacks (one more) and tackles for a loss (six more).

\* Black was a first team All-WVIAC selection and a second team all-region pick in 2009.

\* Black had 11 sacks as a freshman and was a second team All-WVIAC pick.

\* His brother Vince (2004-07) was a two-time first team All-WVIAC selection and the 2007 Defensive Player of the Year. His other brother Nate (2006-09) was also a two-time first team all-conference selection.

## **RECORD PAGE**

\* Senior kick returner Zack Page is one of the top return men in the country, and statistically speaking, may be one of the best ever in Division II.

\* Coming into the 2010 season, Page needs only three more kick return yards and 12 more kick returns to set the NCAA Division II records in each of those categories.

\* Page owns every single season and career record for kick returns at Fairmont State.

\* Last season he had 1,221 kick return yards and two touchdowns despite missing one game.

\* For his career, he has 105 kick returns for 2,628 yards.

\* As a receiver, Page caught his first career touchdown pass against Clarion back in 2008.

### **ON CLARION**

\* **Alfonso Hoggard** returns for 2010 after leading the Golden Eagle ground attack with 1046 yards on 224 carries with 17 touchdowns in 2009.

\* Hoggard, a 5-4, 150-pound, junior, running back, all-purpose player, had a dynamite season for the Golden Eagles. He finished the year ranked No. 1 in the entire PSAC in rushing, scoring, rushing TDs and all-purpose yards in 2009.

\* Senior safety **Nick Sipes** leads the Clarion defense in 2010 after recording 112 tackles including 12 tackles for loss and six sacks.

\* Hoggard and Sipes earned All-America recognition by *Don Hansen's Football Gazette*.

\* Senior **Jacques Robinson** leads the Golden Eagle receivers coming off a 2009 campaign that saw him catch 70 passes for 819 yards with five touchdowns.

\* Kicker **Robert Mamula** is also back after a 2009 season where he was 12-of-16 with a long of 46 and also 25-of-28 on extra points.

\* Sophomore QB **Eric Coxon** is expected to make his first career start for Clarion against the Falcons.

\* Head coach Jay Foster was named the 2009 PSAC-West "Coach of the Year" by a vote of the Western Division coaches. Foster was previously at Slippery Rock where he spent 18 seasons mostly as the defensive coordinator.

\* Clarion received votes in the first AFCA national poll. The Golden Eagles finished just outside of the NCAA playoffs in 2009.

### **BAKER ON THE REBOUND**

\* After a breakout sophomore season, WR Perry Baker suffered through injuries on his way to a disappointing junior campaign.

\* In 2008, Baker caught 34 passes for 589 yards and nine touchdowns. He also rushed for 258 yards and a pair of scores. He was a first team All-WVIAC selection in that year.

\* In 2009, Baker scored on a 54-yard end around in his first touch of the season against Clarion. Unfortunately, he suffered a high ankle sprain on his second carry which plagued him throughout the year. He had just 16 catches for 233 yards a season ago.

\* Baker is the brother of Dallas Baker who starred at the University of Florida. Dallas Baker was drafted by the Pittsburgh Steelers in the seventh round of the 2007 draft and was a member of the squad until 2009.

### **BRUISING BRAZILL**

\* Senior RB Doug Brazill burst on to the scene as a freshman for the Falcons putting up 1,137 yards -- the eighth most in a single season at Fairmont State.

\* Brazill nursed a sore season as a sophomore and shared time running the ball as a junior. Nonetheless, Brazill has 2,253 career rushing yards which is seventh-best for a career at Fairmont State.

\* Brazill is 309 yards shy of sixth place for career rushing at FSU.

\* Brazill found the end zone a career-high seven times in 2009.

\* He had a career-high 219 rushing yards against Clarion as a freshman in 2007. He had just 45 yards in 2008 and 58 yards on the ground last season.

### **UNDER-RATED UNDERWOOD**

\* Plenty of attention is given to free safety Dewey McDonald, but junior Greg Underwood is also a key component to the Falcon secondary.

\* Underwood plays the bandit position in the 3-3-5 scheme.

\* As a freshman, Underwood racked up 80 total tackles -- the second most on the team -- and picked off a pass and recovered five fumbles.

\* Last season, the versatile Underwood registered 68 tackles, eight tackles for a loss and three interceptions.

\* He is a two-time All-WVIAC honorable mention selection.

### **CORNERBACK & POINT GUARD**

\* Ryland Newman, a backup point guard, was a starting cornerback for the Falcons in 2009 and picked off two passes last year.



### UNDER CENTER OPTIONS

\* FSU has several options under center for the 2010 campaign.

\* Fairmont native and Fairmont Senior High standout Logan Moore has ascended the depth chart through camp in August. Moore threw for 6,286 yards and 68 touchdowns for the Polar Bears.

\* Sophomore Brandon Hyler played in just one game in 2009 but saw plenty of reps in spring.

\* Senior Vick Bradford has played in 28 games in his Falcon career. He has thrown for 1,532 career yards and 20 touchdowns. His 2,431 yards of total offense is 14th all-time at Fairmont State. Bradford was slowed by injury in the spring.

### DAN IN THE MIDDLE

\* Senior Dan Dario has been a consistent presence for the Falcons on defense during his career.

\* Dario has played in all 33 games FSU has played over the last three years.

\* He has 131 career total tackles, including 21 for a loss.

### A LONG, STRANGE TRIP

\* Senior J.J. Mayer started the 2009 season as a starting safety and finished as the starting quarterback.

\* Mayer, who played quarterback under Bryan Fisher at Robert C. Byrd High School, was pressed into action on the offensive side of the ball.

\* Despite not playing the position for several years, Mayer completed 50 percent of his passes and had an efficiency rating of 106.93 in six starts under center.

\* He is back on defense for 2010.

### 2009 RECAP NOTES

\* Fairmont State is coming off of a 3-8 record in 2009. FSU finished sixth in the conference with a record of 3-5.

\* The Falcons strength of schedule in 2009 was rated 20th in the country.

\* FSU had three players earn first team All-WVIAC selections in Nate Black, Luke Black and Dewey McDonald. Luke Black will be a junior and McDonald will be a sophomore for the Falcons in 2010.

\* Luke Black also was named second team all-region.

\* The Falcons struggled offensively ranking eighth in the league scoring (19.5 ppg) and total offense (300 ypg). FSU's defense, however, was third in the league in total defense (361 ypg) and fourth in scoring defense (27.8 ppg).

\* Fairmont State's kickoff return unit was first in the league and third in the country in average kickoff returns with 26.2 yards per return.

\* Zack Page's 232 return yards against West Liberty were the most in Division II in 2009. He had two 89-yard returns that game, one that went for a touchdown.

\* FSU was second in the conference in interceptions picking off 17 passes in 2009. The Falcons also had a league-best 298 yards on of interception returns.

\* After going 5-1 against non-conference opponents in 2007 and 2008, FSU was 0-3 against non-conference foes in 2009.

### FOOTBALL HISTORY

\* Fairmont State was the first school in West Virginia to win a national championship in football in 1967 as a member of the NAIA. The Falcons were coached by Deacon Duvall, whose name shares part of FSU's home stadium (Duvall-Rosier Field.)

\* The Falcons have won 17 conference championships -- more than any other school in the WVIAC.

\* FSU last won a conference championship in 2000.

# LAST TIME VS. CLARION (2009)

## CLARION 33, FAIRMONT STATE 21

**FAIRMONT, W.Va.** -- Clarion returned two interceptions for touchdowns to help the Golden Eagles to a 33-21 win over Fairmont State Thursday night in front of a packed Duvall-Rosier Field. Clarion's Tyler Huether was 20-41 for 253 yards and also rushed for a touchdown. Kicker Robert Mamula connected on four field goals for the Golden Eagles including one from 46 yards.

Clarion's Chris Wilson scored on a 40-yard interception return, and Daily Whitten took one back 57 yards for a score. Nick Sipes tallied a game-high 13 total tackles, including 10 solo stops. Ben Maund had three tackles for a loss including a pair of sacks.

The Falcon defense held Clarion to just one offensive touchdown. FSU held the edge in total offensive yards by a 371-346 margin.

Fairmont State had four players rush for over 50 yards as the Falcons piled up 238 yards on the ground. Doug Brazill had 56, Omoniyi Bakare and Scott Victorio each had 53 and Perry Baker had 51 and one touchdown. Baker, who was limited by injury after the first quarter, had one catch for 27 yards.

Derek Taylor started and was 8-17 for 85 yards. Vick Bradford also saw action going 3-7 for 48 yards. The two quarterbacks threw three interceptions, two of which were returned for scores.

Freshman Jack Charles led Fairmont State defensively with six total tackles, including two for a loss and one for an interception. Ryland Newman had a team-high eight tackles.

Clarion's first play from scrimmage was a long pass that set them up with first and goal on the Fairmont State 6-yard line. The Falcon defense tightened allowing just a field goal. The Falcons answered back with a 54-yard touchdown scamper from Baker to put the Falcons on top 7-3. The teams traded possessions and then Clarion was able to add Mamula's second field goal to cut the deficit to 7-6.

Two possessions later, Whitten picked off Taylor and returned it for a touchdown to give Clarion the lead 13-7. On the ensuing FSU possession, Bakare scored from 35 yards out to put the Falcons back on top 14-13. Mamula connected from 46 yards away just before the half to put Clarion on top 16-14 heading to the half.

Clarion picked off Taylor again in the third quarter setting them up with good field position and resulting in a Tyler Huether plunge to put the Golden Eagles ahead 23-14. Clarion would tack on another field goal on their next possession to extend the lead to 26-14. Fairmont State wouldn't go quietly as Bradford would score from 13 yards out to cut the deficit to 26-21. Clarion would seal the game when Wilson picked Bradford off and went forty yards for a touchdown giving Clarion a 33-21 lead.

### CLARION NOTEBOOK

- Fairmont State lost its first season opener in the Mike Lopez era, falling 33-21 to Clarion.
- Four players rushed for over 50 yards and Fairmont State rolled up 238 yards on the ground and out-gained the Golden Eagles 371-346.
- FSU was plagued by a pair of interception for touchdowns. The Falcons lost one fumble and threw three interceptions in the game.
- Fairmont State was just 1-of-3 inside the red zone. The Golden Eagles, however, were 4-of-5. FSU did force field goals on three of those four opportunities.
- An injury to Perry Baker limited his time on the field against Clarion. His first touch of the game, though, resulted in a 54-yard rushing touchdown. It was the third rushing touchdown of his career. He has career TD runs of 49, 54 and 81 yards.
- Freshman nose guard Jack Charles was outstanding in his first appearance for Fairmont State recording six total tackles, two of which went for a loss, and intercepted one pass.
- The FSU defense allowed just 93 yards rushing.
- Redshirt freshman tight end Sean Marion led Fairmont State with four receptions for 47 yards. Three of those receptions went for first downs.
- Vick Bradford scored his eighth rushing touchdown of his career on a 13-yard run in the fourth quarter.
- Freshman Dewey McDonald recorded his first career interception against the Golden Eagles.
- Luke Black forced his third career fumble against Clarion. Drew Rosignol recovered a fumble for the third time in his career.

# LAST TIME AT CLARION (2008)

## FAIRMONT STATE 23, CLARION 20

CLARION, Pa. -- Junior kicker Alex Ashley kicked a 39-yard field goal as time expired to lift Fairmont State to a 23-20 win over Clarion. The Falcons led 20-13 late in the fourth quarter, but a turnover led to a Golden Eagle score with just over three minutes left. The Falcons were able to drive and get in to scoring position to set up the Ashley game-winner. Ashley connected on a career-high three field goals, hitting from 36, 42 and 39 yards.

Vick Bradford tossed for a career-high 184 yards on 10-of-22 passing and two touchdowns. He also rushed 17 times for 53 yards. Travis Hawthorne caught four passes for 56 yards. Perry Baker had two catches for 78 yards and a touchdown, and Zack Page was on the receiving end of a 24-yard touchdown pass from Bradford.

The Fighting Falcon defense held Clarion to just 77 yards rushing and 271 of total offense. Dan Dario led the Falcons with seven total tackles (six solo), including three for a loss. Luke Black had six total tackles and was also credited with three for a loss.

Trailing 7-3, the Falcons responded as Bradford hit Baker on a screen pass that Baker took 72 yards for a touchdown. Late in the half, Clarion booted a field goal to tie the game at 10-10 going into the locker room.

Fairmont State got the ball to open the second half and drove 59 yards on 10 plays, capped by Bradford throwing a 24-yard TD pass to Page. David Hill forced a fumble on the next possession that was recovered by Drew Rossignol, but FSU could not manage a first down and settled for a 42-yard field goal from Ashley giving the Falcons a 20-13 lead after three quarters.

With the ball and just over six minutes to play, the Fighting Falcons gave Clarion new life when Brazill fumbled. The Golden Eagles took advantage and tied the game on a 34-yard TD run with just over three minutes to play.

On Fairmont State's possession, Bradford completed a crucial 2nd and 11 by completing a 15-yard pass to Hawthorne to help move the Falcons down the field. Following the pass, freshman fullback Cody Reed made carries of 13 and nine yards on consecutive plays to set the Falcons up with the ball on the Clarion 33. Brazill broke a 12-yard run on third down to set Ashley up for the game-winning kick. Ashley stepped up with three seconds on the clock and drilled a 39-yard field goal his third of the game to give the Falcons the victory.

# SEASON PREVIEW

---

With numerous sections and components to a football team – even the offense, defense and special teams are each broken down into even smaller subsets – it's easy to see how one mistake can trigger a chain reaction, ultimately leading to a breakdown. That domino effect is encapsulated in the 2009 Fairmont State football team, where one in-game mistake got compounded by another, which led to losses which affected the team's overall confidence for the next game. And, in a short while, the Fighting Falcons had a tough time getting off the mat while facing an incredibly brutal schedule that ranked among the most difficult in the country. What had seemed to be a promising season for the Falcons was almost over before every getting started.

Despite that letdown, head coach Mike Lopez is more determined than ever to lead the Falcons back to glory. While lessons were certainly learned in the 2009 season, Lopez is confident in his approach and philosophy.

"Just because we were losing doesn't mean we're lost," Lopez says emphatically. "When you win, you feel like you have things figured out. When you lose, you evaluate things from A-to-Z, and we've done that and we know where we are and how to get to where we want to be."

## OFFENSE

---

One of the biggest changes from last season is the addition of Bryan Fisher to the coaching staff as the offensive coordinator. Fisher has Division I experience and has spent the last seven seasons as a successful head coach at Robert C. Byrd High School.

"I've known coach Fisher for a long time, I know his demeanor and personality – and it's what we needed," Lopez says. "I think his addition changes our team in terms of moving the ball, scoring points and overall confidence."

Fisher has plenty of weapons at his disposal, but heading into the season is still in search of a guy who can make it all happen from the quarterback position.

Senior Vick Bradford has the most experience of any of the signal callers returning,

but is still recovering from an injury and may not be ready to go by summer camp. Brandon Hyler made some strides in the spring and performed well at the annual Maroon & White game. The Falcons also brought in highly touted local product Logan Moore out of Fairmont Senior High to compete for the job immediately. Colby Treadway is another true freshman who will be given a look in August.

"Having a consistent offensive system is critical for any quarterback to succeed," Lopez says. "Whoever is back there, if they do what the system and what the coaches ask you to do, they'll be fine. And we have quality kids and good leaders back there, and that's key."

The quarterback will have several weapons at his disposal, mainly wideout Perry Baker. Baker, who was slowed the entire year by a high ankle sprain he suffered on his second touch of the season, is fully healthy. Baker is undoubtedly one of the most electric players in the league and should thrive in the offensive system.

"Perry will have the bulls eye on his back once again," Lopez says. "Teams respect his ability. He's dynamic and a game changer. The key for Perry will be to stay healthy and stay on the field so that he can be a factor."

The Falcons also have added 6-3 junior college transfer Eric Eitson as another weapon at wideout. Matt Wilmer had an impressive spring and will see time as a slot receiver. Junior Derek Sevier is a big target, and Falcon cager Chris Thompson joined the football team and impressed the staff with his ability to catch the ball. Freshmen Aaron Fetty, Frank Taitano, Trey Wiggins, Chris St. Hilaire could also have an impact at wide receiver.

In the backfield, the Falcons have a variety of options to suit their plan of attack. Big, bruising back Doug Brazill, who is seventh all-time at Fairmont State in career rushing, gets tough yards between the tackles but also has a burst that can get away from the second level. Sophomore Scott Victorio is a quicker back that Fisher would like to get out in space either out of the backfield or in the slot. Patrick Pinchinat is big at 6-2,

but also has tremendous speed to go with the size. Redshirt freshman Damon Waters and sophomore Matt Griffin have the talent and work ethic to garner playing time as well. Junior fullback Cody Reed is another tough runner who likes to block as much as he likes to carry the ball.

The Falcons will be young and thin up front, but not without talent. Left tackle Matt Khouri, who many believe is among the top linemen in the region, is back to full strength after being injured for portions of the 2009 campaign. Junior Josh Kniceley is a returning starter who is a consistent force at right tackle, and will share time with the 6-7, 300-pound Jon McNemar. Junior Pat Halpin has seen significant time in the lineup during his first two seasons, and he and sophomore Joe Angotti will be in the mix for the job at right tackle. Newcomer Chris Furbee, along with returners Nick Gwinn and Colin Caselman will battle for the job at left guard. Nick Shrader and Chase Lafferty will compete for the center position.

## DEFENSE

---

The Falcon defense, under the direction of Mike Lopez, has consistently given Fairmont State the opportunity to win games over the past few years. However, when the offense struggled, it also impacted the defense as far as time on the field and morale. This year, Lopez hopes that a resurgent offense will have a positive impact on the other side of the ball and make a good defense even better.

The Falcons are big, physical and deep up front, and have game-changing talent in the secondary in 2010. In between, FSU will need to develop its linebacking corps to be the top unit it expects to be.

The Falcons feature several talented players that they can use in a variety of ways up front in its 3-3 stack defense. One of those is defensive end junior Luke Black. Black exploded onto the scene as a freshman with 11 sacks in his first year, but faced much more attention in his second year. Even though his sack numbers dipped as teams paid much more attention to him, his total tackles went up and the respect for his play was evidenced by him earning first team All-WVIAC honors and second team all-region recognition.

"When you have an odd front, it's easy to double him, and I think teams paid attention to him," Lopez says. "Sacks don't tell the story about Luke's play – we were happy with his play. He's a different, special kid who is developing into a good leader."

Junior Tony Patterson will see an increased role on the other end of the line. Patterson made four starts as a sophomore and recorded 33 tackles. Shane Springer, M.J. Twyman, Shane Springer and Jordan Greathouse will all see plenty of action up front as part of a regular rotation.

In the middle of the line the Falcons return sophomore Jack Charles. Charles is a classic nose guard at 6-0 and well over 300 pounds. Devin Johnson has the strength to play at nose but also the athletic ability to play on the end if called upon as well.

For the first time in several years the FSU linebackers will not be anchored by either Vince or Nate Black. Senior middle linebacker Dan Dario has been a regular in his time at Fairmont State playing in 33 games and recording 133 total tackles during that time and is expected to lead the linebacker unit.

At strong side linebacker, redshirt freshman James McVeigh is a smart player who had a strong spring that will allow him to be the starter at that position in the fall. Junior David Pack was second on the team in tackles in 2009 with 68 and will need to continue to progress and build off that season.

At the weak side linebacker, two players who have previously seen limited action will be asked to step up into a more prominent role. Junior Brian Turner played in eight games and made two starts in 2009, and senior Parker Deem played in all 11 games and made three starts for the Falcons last season.

In the secondary, FSU features one of the top athletes in the league in sophomore Dewey McDonald at the at free safety position. McDonald picked off five passes last year and set a school record with 161 interception return yards (including one 85-yard return for a touchdown). He used his speed to break up five passes and his strength to force three fumbles. He was a first team All-WVIAC pick and will continue to be a focal point when offensive coaches look at Fair-

mont State's defense on film.

"Dewey has really progressed fast, and he's going to continue in that direction," Lopez says. "He's a good player and obviously has a lot of talent. He's also developing into a leader for us as well."

Junior Greg Underwood, who plays the bandit position, is another versatile athlete in the Falcon secondary. Underwood had 68 tackles a season ago, including eight for a loss and three sacks, in addition to picking off three passes and breaking up three others. Senior J.J. Mayer, who split time on the defense and at quarterback last year, is a smart player who is another good option at the position. Nick Higinbotham has been slowed by injuries but as good speed and can supply depth for the Falcons. At the spur position, sophomore Daniel Strosnider returns after playing in all 11 games and making six starts a season ago.

At corner, junior Ryland Newman and sophomore Scott Davidson are expected to see action. Newman, who also plays basketball for the Falcons, was a regular starter last season, but still needs to be more consistent on each play. Davidson was primarily a reserve last season but had a strong spring. Junior Raynell Hall and redshirt freshman Ronnie Lockhart are talented players who will see regular action for the Falcons. Lopez would like to develop more depth at the position once camp starts.

### ***SPECIALISTS***

On special teams, the Falcons boast senior return man Zack Page, who has a chance at several NCAA Division II records in terms of kick returns and yardage. Page, a two-time second team All-WVIAC specialist, had over 1,000 kick return yards and took two kicks back for touchdown. He gives the Falcon offense good field position nearly every time he gets an opportunity. Page, along with Scott Victorio, are also viable options as a punt returner.

Punter Ben Landis returns this fall after missing last season with a knee injury. English place kicker Frank Keenan joined the team in the spring and has a live leg. Landis and Keenan are working in the offseason to round out their skills so that they will be able to back each other up in case of injury.

### ***SCHEDULE***

Once again, the Falcons will face one of the toughest schedules in the country. Last season, FSU's strength of schedule was ranked 20th in the country. Many of those teams, including two teams that made the NCAA playoffs, dot the 2010 schedule.

The Falcons open up with the PSAC member Clarion, who completely turned the program around in 2009 and posted a 7-3 record. The Golden Eagles spent several weeks regionally ranked. FSU will open things up at home against Notre Dame College out of Cleveland the following week.

After that, the Falcons begin a treacherous stretch as WVIAC play opens. The Falcons take on perennial conference power Shepherd, followed by talented rival Glenville State, a team that will be looking to avenge a 50-37 loss last season in front of a televised audience. After that, the nation will turn its attention to Fairmont and Duvall-Rosier Field as the Falcons welcome nationally ranked West Liberty on a Thursday night. The game will be televised live nationally on CBS College Sports as part of the NCAA Division II's television deal.

Things don't get any easier after that as FSU travels to face Charleston, a team that narrowly missed out on the playoffs last year and UNC Pembroke, a team that did make the playoffs in 2009. Fairmont State closes the season with three of its final four games at home against WV Wesleyan, Seton Hill (Homecoming) and WV State. The Falcons will travel to Concord prior to the final game of the year against the Yellow Jackets.
